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Reporting Policy

This policy should be considered alongside and in conjunction with the **Curriculum and Assessment Policy**.

1. Introduction

The purpose of the reporting process is to provide regular feedback to the students and their parents so that all parties can keep abreast of, and make a purposeful positive impact upon, each student's learning and development. To this end the school compiles four reports each year, over a two semester reporting period, comprising:

- A. Mid Semester 1: IB MYP G6 10 and IB DP G11 progress reports; IB DP G12 DP summative 1-7 IB grades; mentor comments; student reflections based on learner profile.
- B. Semester 1: G6-12 IB summative 1-7 grades; G6-10 IB MYP criterion levels; teacher comments; student reflections and goal setting.
- C. Mid Semester 2: IB MYP G6-9 report progress reports; IB MYP G10 and IB DP G11 summative 1-7 grades; student reflections based on ATLs.
- D. Semester 2: G6-12 IB summative 1-7 grades; G6-10 IB MYP criterion levels; mentor comments; student reflections on goals set; G10 MYP Personal Project Comment.

Reports are issued to parents electronically; are produced using the school's Managebac system; are available in printed format upon request; and provide grades for student transcripts.

2. Reports

Reports are:

- A. published quarterly in November, January, March/April and July
- B. consist of detailed subject reports compiled by the teacher, for all recognised International Baccalaureate Middle Years Programme and International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme subjects included in the student's schedule
- C. include details of student progress and final achievement against each criterion of assessment
- D. include a summative report from the student's learning mentor.

3. Three-way Parent/Student/Teacher Conferences





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Three-way conferences are held twice a year, at mid-semester. At these conferences, parents, students and teachers meet together to discuss the student's progress in all areas of the curriculum. Students are required to be present, and are frequently asked to lead the discussions.

4. Grading System

Halcyon uses the International Baccalaureate 1-7 grading system for summative grades on reports, as follows:

- 7 = Excellent
- 6 = Very good
- 5 = Good
- 4 = Satisfactory
- 3 = Mediocre
- 2 = Poor
- 1 = Very poor

Every IB MYP subject has four criteria, graded 1 - 8, and these criteria, which are tailored for each subject, are published through ManageBac. Full descriptions of each of the subject criteria are provided to parents and shown on the reports.

5. Australian Council for Educational Research (ACER) International Schools' Assessment (ISA) Results

Halcyon students take the International Schools' Assessment examinations, in maths, English and science. <u>ISA</u> tests can be taken in term 1 or term 2, and detailed scores and analysis are provided to teachers, parents and students.

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This policy will be reviewed annually, or more regularly in light of any significant changes in statutory requirements and legislation.
